Vision Empowering akonga to be culturally inclusive and engaged community members of the future. Striving to excel, standing with pride and connecting with spirit.




Mission Ebbett Park School will challenge students to excel and provide them With all they require to be lifelong learners.

I am growing extremely concerned by the ever INCREASING rate of absenteeism of some of our tamariki.

The impact of our tamariki being away from school on a regular basis goes well beyond simply missing out on learning. While it has a devastating affect on a child's achievement and their future learning capabilities and academic development it can also damage the relationships between students and teachers, as well as between students and their peers.

The infographic below indicates the impact absences have on student learning.



Understandably there are times when absence can be expected, such as illness and

attendance at funerals/tangi. HOWEVER, the UNEXPLAINED and UNJUSTIFIED absences are of a huge concern. Simply NOT SENDING your tamariki to school is NOT HELPING THIER LEARNING or THIER FRIENDSHIPS.

Education in New Zealand is 'Free' and is expected. There is an expectation that parents/ whānau do the 'right thing' for their tamariki and provide them with access to education. The regular non-attendees at school are not getting this access.

I implore you to send your tamariki to school everyday, unless genuinely unwell, so that they are given the learning opportunities they deserve.

If your tamariki is not at school expect the school to take an active and a hardline approach to their lack of attendance. We NEED and WANT your tamariki at SCHOOL.

If your child is away you MUST notify school of the absence. This can be done via a call directly to the school office (06 878 9599) and/or via the 'Absentee' tab on the Skool Loop App. For every absence it is VITAL that a reason is given, just 'being away' is not an acceptable explanation.

If whānau are experiencing issues around your child's attendance please make contact with either Kate or Hamish so that support can be put into place.


Class Dojo: Used to support and share student selfmanagement and behaviour management with whānau. (download from apps store)
