Seasons for Growth[®] programmes aim to strengthen the social and emotional wellbeing of those attending following significant loss and change, and to support individuals to adapt to what they are experiencing.

The metaphor of the four seasons provides a framework within which participants can explore their experiences of grief with others, develop skills and understanding, and restore self-esteem and self-confidence.

Monday 27 June 2022

Higgins Contractors has been awarded the contract under Hastings District Council to upgrade some of the wastewater and drainage systems along Maraekākaho Road, Bledisloe Road and Campbell Street.

Where is the work happening?

- Maraekākaho Rd from Gordon Rd up to no. 701
- Bledisloe St from Cobham St up to no. 902
- Campbell St from Wall Rd to Bledisloe St

When's it happening?

The work is happening in stages. It will start on Maraekākaho Rd on Monday 4 July, with the aim of finishing late September. The work on Bledisloe St and Campbell Street will kick off when the Maraekākaho Rd stretch is complete. The team intend to have everything done by November.

How will it impact residents?

You may hear a bit of noise between 7am to 6pm from Monday to Saturday. If any work impacts your property, we will be in touch directly.


