Hawkes Bay Infrastructure are to complete watermain, storm water and sewer connections from the property development area of Number 515 Oliphant Road, Hastings, opposite your school. There are 3 stages involved, Stage one is expected to take 3 days to complete, stage 2 will take 2 days and the final stage, 3 days to complete, weather permitting. We are looking to start works around Monday 22nd of August 2022.

1. The front netball court will be closed and dedicated to staff parking. This will be coned off with access to classrooms and office clearly visible.

2. Entering school will be via WALL ROAD entrance for ALL tamariki

3.Exiting school will be via WALL ROAD for ALL tamariki except those that live on Oliphant Road, Southland Road or in the housing beyond (Gascoigne, Montgomery, Murdoch). These learners will join the walking bus from Oliphant Road to the Southland Road crossing, with Mr Dufty, who will ensure they cross over and head home together.




