# Morning Drop Off, Afternoon Pick Up and Parking

While I know that entering and exiting via Wall Road is not ideal I appreciate the support and understanding our whānau, neighbours and community have shown us during the challenging time.

As we head into the winter months we are expecting to see an increase in traffic on Wall Road. Therefore, it is VITAL that we all practice safe driving methods.

Please avoid: parking in or in front of our neighbours driveways

doing U-turns from one side to another of Wall Road

double parking

turning up too early for the exit of your child/ren

The purpose of staggered exits is to ensure that we DO NOT have an excess of traffic at one time.

- 2.30pm is for Road Patroller and YMCA OSCAR students ONLY
- 2.40pm is for those that have siblings also attending Ebbett Park School
- 2.45pm is for those learners that DO NOT have any siblings attending Ebbett Park School.

Pick ups are being hindered by families that park early and wait for the last group to exit. If you could wait much closer to 2.40 our whanau groups will be exiting and parks will become free of you to park and pick up your precious tamariki.
