What are our Values Bands?

Our values Bands are given to students who have been recognised by our staff with a Values Voucher. When students reach 50 **Classdojo** point they automatically earn a Values Voucher. These Values Vouchers are collected and a tally is kept. Once they have earned a certain amount students receive a Values Band. This is an important part of our school-wide reward scheme.

Classdojo

How do parents use **Classdojo**? Everyday your child's teacher will be adding **Classdojo** points when your child shows off their amazing talents or show our school-wide classroom expectations. Parents can also view this once they have connection to the app and used the code provided by their child's teacher.

Students see and hear **Classdojo** in their classroom everyday. Sometimes points will be taken off when behaviour expectations are not followed. **Classdojo** is also a great way of home and school communicating. Many parents have also used **Classdojo** as a way of rewarding their child at the end of the week - set a points goals and encourage your child to reach it.
